Akasaka Palace Tokyo 2 December 2022

Prime Minister of Japan, President of Moldova, excellencies, dear guests

I am honoured to address you all on the eve of our distinguished conference, the World Assembly for Women. The venue is grand, it fits the occasion because our common cause is worthy. Together, we need to work for gender equality and women's empowerment – here in Japan, in our home countries, in the whole wide world.
